*The Bronx*

Provides parenting support, after-school, mentoring, and summer camp programs.

### **ALL ANGELS' CHURCH**

*The West Side*

Empowers and equips people struggling with homelessness, addiction, and mental health challenges to be dependent on God.

### **AVAIL NYC**

*The West Side, The East Side, Midtown*

Offers confidential care for those making decisions about unplanned pregnancies and those seeking support after an abortion.

*Citywide*

Offers running and community to homeless individuals to bring about positive life change and economic stability.

### **BEACON CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER**

*Staten Island*

Provides quality, affordable healthcare that also addresses an individual's physical, emotional and spiritual well-being.

### **THE BOWERY MISSION**

*Citywide*

*(\*Includes several affiliate programs across the city)*

Serves New Yorkers experiencing homelessness through basic needs services and faith-based residential programs. Also serves children and youth through after-school classes and one-on-one mentoring.

### **THE BRIDGE**

*The West Side*

Offers transitional housing and supportive programs for men and women with serious mental illness, histories of substance abuse; those who are homeless; and people living with HIV/ AIDS. HFNY specifically partners with the Rita Berger House program.

### **BROOKLYN ARAB AMERICAN FRIENDSHIP CENTER**

*Brooklyn*

Offers English as a Second Language classes and cultural activities to newly immigrated Arab Americans.

### **BROOKLYN TEEN CHALLENGE**

*Brooklyn*

Provides a residential faith-based recovery program for individuals with life-controlling issues, plus food and support to the community.

### **CENTER FOR ALL ABILITIES**

*Downtown*

Seeks to serve individuals with special needs and their families through creative, educational, and spiritual enrichment in a faith-guided environment.

### **CHINESE CHRISTIAN HERALD CRUSADES**

*Downtown, Queens, Brooklyn*

Offers education, mentoring, recreation, and spiritual hope for the Chinese-American community.

### **CITY RELIEF**

*Uptown, The Bronx, The West Side*

Runs a mobile soup kitchen outreach with buses to provide food, counseling, spiritual help, and resources for communities in need.

### **CITYMEALS-ON-WHEELS**

*Citywide*

Provides a continuous lifeline of nutritious food and human company to homebound elderly New Yorkers in need.

### **CODE FOR LIFE (NEW)**

*Uptown*

Equips young people in under-resourced neighborhoods with practical technological tools and skills for thriving in their lives.

### **COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS FOR YOUTH**

*The Bronx*

Empowers grassroots faith and neighborhood organizations to develop community alternatives to incarceration for youth.

### **CRU INNER CITY**

*Queens*

Partners with local churches in low-income neighborhoods to provide a multitude of resources, including food and clothing, job readiness training, and youth programs.

### **DEFY VENTURES**

*The West Side, Downtown, Midtown*

Provides opportunities for entrepreneurship, leadership, and career development to men and women with criminal histories.

### **DO FOR ONE**

*The East Side, The West Side, Queens*

Connects people with disabilities who are socially excluded to advocates for supportive, one-to-one relationships.

### **DREAM CENTER NYC**

*Citywide*

Offers neighborhood-based community programs that provide basic food and hygiene needs to individuals and families in public housing.

## **EXODUS TRANSITIONAL COMMUNITY**

*Uptown*

Provides supportive services to formerly incarcerated men and women.

## **EXPECT HOPE**

*The Bronx*

Provides a Christ-centered residential program that serves unsupported women 18+ years of age during crisis pregnancies and through their child's second birthday.

## **THE FATHER'S HEART MINISTRIES**

*Downtown*

Demonstrates God's love by addressing the needs of those who are unemployed, at-risk, immigrants, homeless, or who lack social or family support.

## **GARDEN OF HOPE**

*Queens*

Provides shelter, crisis intervention, and counseling for women and children who have been victims of domestic violence, abuse, or human trafficking.

## **GIFTED HANDS**

*Citywide*

Provides hope and healing to underserved youth and adults through educational art programs that build self-esteem and teach new skills.

## **GRAFFITI**

*Downtown*

Ministers to the East Village community through programs and services that offer food, clothing, tutoring, and afterschool activities.

## **GRAFFITI 2**

*The Bronx*

Helps individuals living in the Mott Haven neighborhood of the South Bronx to grow physically, mentally, emotionally, socially, and spiritually.

## **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY**

*Uptown, Brooklyn, Queens*

Mobilizes volunteers to revitalize community centers and construct affordable housing for low-income families.

## **HILLSIDE EDUCATION CENTER**

*Queens*

Empowers immigrant communities in Jamaica, Queens to achieve their God-given potential by providing programs taught by certified tutors.

## **INWOOD HOUSE**

*The Bronx*

Provides a residence for pregnant and parenting teens who are homeless, in foster care, or aged out of foster care.

## **ISAIAH 58**

*Downtown*

Offers a volunteer-led worship service and outreach to people living with HIV/AIDS at Bailey House.

## **LIVING WATERS FELLOWSHIP**

*Brooklyn*

Provides after-school programs, English as a Second Language classes for adults, and breakfast to the local community.

## **MONT LAWN CITY CAMP**

*The Bronx, Uptown*

Provides mentoring, tutoring, practical, and spiritual help for at-risk youth and their families.

## **NEIGHBORHOOD COALITION FOR SHELTER**

*The East Side, The Bronx*

Provides housing and support to chronically homeless individuals.

## **NEW BEGINNINGS CENTER OF HOPE**

*Queens*

Equips women experiencing unplanned pregnancy to make informed decisions that lead to life-affirming choices.

## **NEW LIFE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION**

*Queens*

Provides academic enrichment, food and clothing, health care, and community for the poor and marginalized in the Elmhurst and Corona neighborhoods of Queens.

## **NEXT STEP COMMUNITY CHURCH BROOKLYN**

*Brooklyn*

Helps hurting people heal by providing holistic care to those experiencing or recovering from addiction in Downtown Brooklyn.

## **THE OPEN DOOR**

*The West Side*

Empowers immigrants to reach their full God-given potential through weekly ESL, GED, TASC, and computer courses, plus community building.

## **OPEN HANDS LEGAL SERVICES**

*Citywide*

Provides free legal aid, advocacy, and spiritual support to those who are poor and disenfranchised of New York City.

## **OPERATION EXODUS INNER CITY**

*Uptown*

Offers mentoring, after-school programs, and internship opportunities for Latino students (K-12) in Washington Heights, Inwood, and the Bronx.

## **PRISON FELLOWSHIP**

*Queens*

Works to bring hope and restoration to prisoners, families, and communities impacted by crime and incarceration.

## **PROJECT FIND**

*The West Side*

Provides support services to seniors who are low- to moderate-income and homeless.

## **REACH FAMILY AND EDUCATION CENTER**

*Brooklyn*

Offers faith-based educational support to low-income and immigrant families.

## **RESCUE ALLIANCE**

*Citywide*

A coalition of faith-based agencies seeking to restore the well-being of those on the street through compassionate, comprehensive, and collaborative care.

## **RESTORE NYC**

*Citywide*

Identifies survivors of sex trafficking and provides long-term, holistic aftercare services for adult female survivors.

## SAFE FAMILIES FOR CHILDREN

### *Citywide*

Provides support for parents in crisis, giving them time to get back on their feet while their children are cared for in safe environments.

## THE SALVATION ARMY

### *Downtown, The West Side, Uptown*

Provides services to those in need, including emergency social service programs, after-school programs, and disaster relief.

## SHILOH NYC

### *The East Side*

Offers school-based academic programs, group mentoring meetings to provide academic and spiritual guidance, and summer camp experiences to NYC youth.
